Project Description

The Arizona Adverse Childhood Experiences Consortium (AZ ACEs Consortium) has been engaged by the Maricopa County Department of Public Health to develop and implement a Maricopa County-wide ACEs plan that includes training and educating leaders who work with youth such as in a school or community-based agency setting as well as the youth from those settings. The project leverages the unique expertise of the AZ ACEs Consortium's leadership, members, and partners to:

- Educate and support schools in implementing trauma informed practices
- Create a robust resource library
- Educate school administration and community organizations
- Engage system leaders to provide education on the importance of trauma awareness programs

Position Core Responsibilities

Working closely with the AZ ACEs Consortium's Executive Director, the Project Manager will oversee the project, which includes performing and being accountable for the following:

- 1. Coordinating curriculum development
 - Work with the Resilience Coordinating Council of the AZ ACEs Consortium, the Executive Director and other consultants to ensure that the curricula for the training modules are evidence informed, conform to the recommendations and are delivered on time.
 - Ensure that the curricula meets the needs and demographics of targeted individuals and organizations.
 - Coordinate the production of online training with acquired vendor(s).
- 2. Coordinating the Training of Schools, Community Organizations, Youth, and Administration

- Recruit schools, community organizations, and administration to receive training.
- Coordinate training logistics including training dates, locations and trainers.
- Ensure that training staff and teams deliver the training in a timely fashion.

3. Recruit and train Trauma Informed Ambassadors

- Work with the Resilience Coordinating Council and Executive Director to develop training and requirements for Trauma Informed Ambassadors.
- Be point of contact and keep up on the requirements for the Ambassadors

4. Coordinating a Community of Practice

- Develop a framework for a robust community of practice for all Trauma Informed Ambassadors and community organizations to continue to develop their education on trauma responsive practices.
- Coordinate meeting logistics and facilitate community of practice meetings.

5. Overseeing On-Going Support

- Provide trauma sensitive leadership and sensitive of team members.
- For the duration of the contract, monitor the activities of team members as they work with schools and community based organizations. When necessary, help team members access additional resources to support their work.

6. Providing Financial Oversight

• Ensure that invoices are received and submitted for approval by the Executive Director, and that they conform to all funder stipulations.
