Community Impact & Challenges Identified Systemic Issues:

- Frontier and tribal communities receiving services last
- High rates of substance abuse across multiple communities
- Gang violence and community safety concerns
- Extreme poverty affecting student stability and learning
- Intergenerational trauma requiring culturally specific interventions

Successful Approaches:

- Relationship-based service delivery over 2-3 year periods
- Cultural identity strengthening through traditional practices
- Language preservation integrated with mental health services
- Community-led change initiatives rather than external impositions
- Trust-building as prerequisite for effective service delivery
